










WA State agencies meeting with Mabton residents about water quality issues.

The City of Sunnyside and the Port of Sunnyside announced it has entered into a public comment period on the proposed BioMethane Plant/Digester project and residents may voice any concerns about the economic and environmental impact the project may have. The plant would use anaerobic digesters to process local manure and agricultural waste to create natural gas. We can assist you to enter your public comment to the city and port. 
community meeting about the Pacific Ag project.

- Why hasn't any information been provided in Spanish to Spanish-speaking residents?


